Hello and welcome to the first Shockleader of 2021 and belated good wishes to you all for the new year.

Coronavirus pandemic update- 9th January

The CFSA Committee have now discussed the news that angling is allowed to resume during the lockdown subject to strict Government criteria.

Whilst this is good news for all of us, this is not a green light to resume all of our normal fishing activities.

In consideration of the available Government and Angling Trust Covid guidance and to ensure a fair and level playing field for all CFSA members fishing in both the Boat and Shore categories we felt that it would not be sensible or appropriate to resume the recording of fish for CFSA awards at the current time.

The available guidance clearly indicates that we should be seeking to reduce travel and reduce any social interaction. The key considerations that we have taken into account are as follows (set out by the Angling Trust)

- 1. This is a strictly limited resumption of <u>local</u> fishing and very different to how we have been allowed to operate since May.
- 2. We are in a national lockdown and this must be respected. The law requires a <u>reasonable</u> excuse to leave your home or penalties will apply.
- 3. The Government has recognised that fishing can be seen as exercise which is expressly permitted under the lockdown rules, although outdoor recreation is not.
- 4. Organised sporting gatherings are prohibited, so no match fishing. Exercise is limited to once a day, so no overnight fishing whatsoever.
- 5. To remain within the law you should follow the Governments guidance and only fish locally. If yo have no local fishing available then you will have to take your daily exercise in other ways. The Committee fully recognise that it is every persons right to choose what they do and how they interpret the rules.

The same is for affiliated CFSA clubs and their respective Committees, we do however feel that there is a need for our organisation to show responsibility and follow the spirit of the lockdown guidance to protect members of the public and our members wherever possible. The temporary suspension of recording fish for the CFSA is at least consistent and clear for all members.

Enjoy the opportunity to fish while you can and we all hope we can get back to normal as soon as possible, we will review the position again in a months time, unless the lockdown is lifted before then.

Bass regulations 2021

Catch and release of all Bass until the 31st March and then from the 1st April to the 30th October the Recreational Angler is permitted to keep two fish per day.

November and December is catch and release of all Bass, but of course the regulations can change.

New Year Honour


Many congratulations to Captain Derek Goodwin from Perranporth who has been awarded a MBE in the New Year honours list for services to studying fish populations in Cornwall.

The inclusive years from 1986 to 1998 Derek was the CFSA's Conservation Officer and also a member of Perranporth SAC for many years.

Derek carried on the work started by Donovan Kelly in the early 1970's netting sampling, measuring and recording information on 'O' group juvenile Bass.

This information was passed to the Marine Biological Association in Plymouth plus other interested agencies including BASS who found this information vital in their research of Bass.

Derek has had a dedicated group of people who has helped with the netting and sampling, many whom have been CFSA members. For his special work Derek was also honoured with a CFSA Life Membership.
